It must be strong enough to support a water bottle and high enough for a box to pass under it." 



Saving Whales: One Drone at a Time



Another group of Olin students and recent alumni returned from a research trip in the Gulf of Mexico where they tested drones that will be used to answer real-world research questions related to the health of whales. Gloucester-based Ocean Alliance, an internationally renowned whale and ocean conservation research group, led the trip. The drones, dubbed "Snot Bots," were created in Olin's robotics lab with the help and guidance of Mechanical Engineering Professor Drew Bennett. Matt Rush '14, Silas Hughes '14 and Jay Wu '15 spent 10 days aboard the research vessel Odyssey. The **Boston Globe** has covered the innovative effort.
